

The Tour - Savannah and her Low Country - \$100 p/p*

Join us for a photo adventure not only in that grand lady of the south, Savannah, but in the Lowcountry that surrounds her.

Base camp will be [Skidaway Island State Park](#). All food and beverages will be provided. Your own camping gear and personal care items, and of course your camera gear, is all you need. If you need camping gear, let us know ahead of time and we will try to accommodate you.

Friday afternoon we will head to [Wormsloe Historic Site](#), a breathtaking avenue sheltered by Spanish moss, which leads to the tabby ruins of Wormsloe, the colonial estate of Noble Jones (1702-1775).

After an early campfire breakfast on Saturday morning, we will head to Tybee Island for some early morning images. On the way back, we will stop at [Ft. Pulaski](#) for gorgeous interior shots and, tide permitting, a walk out to the historic Ft. Pulaski Lighthouse.

On the town around noon, a leisurely stroll down River Street for a bit of shopping perhaps or some famous Savannah Sweets, and then head to Bonaventure Cemetery in the late afternoon to photograph some of their gorgeous grounds and statues.

Friday evening has us touring Savannah by horse-drawn carriage and getting a taste for a bit of Savannah's long and fascinating history, dating back to it's founding in 1733 and celebrated in the book and movie "Midnight in the Garden of Good and Evil.

A late dinner at campsite, a good night's rest, then Sunday morning we break camp before dawn and are off for an early drive down the coast to Brunswick, GA and points in between!

For anyone craving a slice of history and the grace of the old South, this is the field trip for you. You'll be able to celebrate your passion for photography, seek your own vision, hone your seeing and imaging skills, and learn about the magic of light to create wonderful photographs.

Itinerary is subject to change due to weather conditions. A \$25 non-refundable deposit is required to reserve this Field Trip. Balance due seven days prior to Field Trip.

What's included? All campsite meals are included, plus soft drinks and water throughout the day. Campsite Fees, Carriage Ride and park admissions are also included. Saturday 'Lunch on the Town' is your responsibility.

Group Size: Enrollment is strictly limited to 10 participants.

Transportation: You are responsible for your own transportation to and from the various stopping points during the tour, although carpooling is encouraged. A good deal of our time spent at the various locations will be on foot.

Food: Campsite meals and beverages are provided, along with soft drinks and water during our travels. Please DO notify us on your Registration if you have any SERIOUS food allergies.

Alcohol: Consumption or use of alcoholic beverages and/or intoxicants is strictly prohibited in Georgia State Parks except in rental facilities

Accommodations: Two five-person campsites have been reserved. Please bring your camping gear (tent, sleeping bag, mess kit, etc.) with you. If you need camping gear, please let us know and we will try to accommodate you.

Tips and Miscellaneous Fees: The registration fee includes all admission fees. You are responsible for any service tips and any items of a personal nature.

Smoking Policy: Smoking is permitted provided you are considerate of other participants. We will be outdoors a good deal of the time and you will have ample opportunity to 'light up' if you desire.

Health Considerations: Many of the city streets in Savannah are original cobblestone, so comfortable walking shoes are recommended. Otherwise, the areas we will be visiting are pretty much flat. We will be 'up and at 'em' from early morning until early evening which can make for a long day if you are not accustomed to such.

Liability: A release waiver is included in the information you will receive when you register. All participants must sign this waiver prior to the start of the tour.

Trip Planning Information: When you register for any event, we will promptly send confirmation along with detailed information to help you plan your trip.

Registration Information and Refund Policy: To register for Savannah and her Low Country, simply click the PayPal link on the website. You need not have a PayPal account; all that is required is a credit card. You may either send only your deposit of \$25 immediately with full payment due seven (7) days prior to the photography tour.

(*) A \$25 discount is given to all members in good standing of the Sunbelt Photography Club. Membership will be verified through the Club's Treasurer.

Cancellation Policy:

- 15 days prior to departure: Full refund.
- 0 to 14 days prior to departure: Full refund if your vacancy is filled; otherwise, you will be charged 25% of the tour fee.
- If for some reason the event is canceled, you will receive a full refund of the registration fee. However, we cannot be responsible for any non-refundable travel expenses you may have incurred. You are urged to purchase travel protection insurance.

Expectation: There is great camaraderie among photographers; getting together and sharing the photography of places you wouldn't necessarily get to on your own, and being able to 'talk the talk' of photography with folks who speak and understand your language. Sometimes seeing through the eyes of another photographer improves your craft, and sometimes answering questions helps another member of the group. That is what this photography tour is about. The itinerary subject to change due to weather conditions but, all in all, a wholesome and fund weekend of photography should be expected by all.

A published and award-winning photographer, Ms. Wace completed her formal education at Southeastern Center for the Arts in Atlanta, GA under the direction of Neil Chaput de Saintonge. During that time, she had the opportunity to study with some of this era's finest photographers including Cole Weston, Bruce Barnbaum and Alison Shaw.

"Oftentimes as I am traveling I wish there was someone with me to see the magic. With childlike wonder I will catch myself pointing to a scene and saying out loud 'Look at THAT'. And while I do love the freedom of shooting alone, at the end of the day, I want to share those images with everyone. Thanks to the internet, I can now do just that."

Ms. Wace's first book, ['Twenty-Four Exposures'](#) is a collection of her favorite photographs from her vast travels around the country. Included along with the images are quotes from notable personalities about the beauty of the world and the importance of caring for the environment.

Ms. Wace currently resides in Savannah, GA where the scenic landscapes and lifestyle of the region have inspired her to publish two additional photographic works. Her latest coffee-table style photo books will be filled with images and anecdotes about life in coastal Georgia entitled 'Sea' and of the surrounding countryscapes entitled "Country Roads".
